### SIZE REQUIREMENTS

All submitted works **must be EXACTLY 30''W; Height may vary from 30'' – 60''**. No rigid, mounted, or framed entries will be considered.

# **EXHIBITION THEME:** The Artist's Question ... Answered in Fiber

Creating a work of art begins with a question. The artist might ask: What idea is important for me to communicate? What concept do I want to explore? What emotions do I want to experience and evoke in the viewer? What interests me? Or perhaps the artist might contemplate: Why do we...?; What would happen if...?; What is the meaning of...?"

Each work of art will resolve or examine the question(s) asked by the artist. Answers will unfold differently as artists create compositions which address their unique queries. Content of the work may be representational or abstract. The style may be narrative, commentary, or purely aesthetic. There are no other limits on content or method.

Artists are asked to begin their artist statement with the question(s) inspiring the work entered. Statements will focus on concepts, <u>not</u> media or technique.

Additionally, to draw the viewer in, each artwork must be titled to reflect the artist's answer to the root question. For example: Suppose the artist's root question was, "How can I convey my deep spiritual connection to trees through fabric silhouettes?" The finished work might be titled "Connection to Trees - Blue Rapture."

### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

EARLY REGISTRATION WITH DISCOUNT: September I - 30, 2021. \$25 Fee for up to three entries. **To take advantage of the discounted entry fee, registration must be completed by September 30, 2021, 11:59pm Eastern Time.** 

REGULAR REGISTRATION: October 1 - 30, 2021. \$30 Fee for up to three entries. At 12:00am Eastern Time on October 1st the registration fee will revert to \$30 USD for up to 3 entries.

Several members attended the zoom lecture sponsored by the Surface Design Guild featuring Jane Dunnewold on Botanicals using paints, inks and dyes. It was well received. . Several also have been attending Jane's 3 part class titled CRACKING THE COLOR CODE. #### **BLUE HAND STUDIO**

Blue Hands Studio was formed in the spring of 2020 when Perlie Petrillo, Valerie Johnson, and Kim Laffont scheduled an impromptu playdate to experiment with Japanese indigo Shibori fabric dyeing. The process was so much fun, we met the following week to try our hands at dyeing Ice Blooms. Our meetings turned into a regular date where we set to learning hot and cold fabric dyeing, tie-dyeing, fabric painting, stenciling, and discharging. As we tried each technique with took notes, researched, studied, and tried to absorb as much as possible from the day. Powders and potions were cooked up, sheets were ripped and dipped, and string, rubber bands, and wire were put to use to twist and manipulate fabric. It got messy; it got hot, but we persisted. We fed off each other, trying to outdo each other'.

BLUE HAND STUDIO - SAQA Members, Perlie Petrillo, Kim Laffont and Valerie participated in the Peacock Arts Festival on Saturday, November 14, 2020. This show had local artists from the Fort Pierce area. We were also provided a room to display our art quilts for one month. This is one of Perlie's art quilts. Kim has a display of her 'fanciful fish' (collages). And below is Valerie's Yellow Flower.


