KC Grapes shared a fantastic color wheel that has helped tame her frustrations with color. It's called "Simple Color System" and was created by David M. Kessler, who is a painter (great abstracts!) It's

available on his website or on Amazon. The most important thing it helps with is getting percentages of each color to work well together, whether complementary, triadic, analogous, or tetradic. We all learned a lot, and I think more than a few have already ordered their new color wheels.

PROGRAM:

Emma Newsham curated a slide show of all of the Fresh Fish entries that were submitted to her. We took turns sharing about our sea creatures, why we picked them, and how we created them. Some of us also had sent Emma our inspiration photos, which made it even more interesting. Thank you, Emma!

Kestrel Michaud also showed our Pod Group entry – a giant pink octopus with tentacles made by 8 different members and the head made by KC Grapes. She was quite the glamour queen (the octopus, not KC!)


