

Individual members can volunteer to provide a short (10 - 15 minute) presentation that regional reps can use to enrich their regional meetings. This can be a live talk, slideshow, video, PowerPoint, Keynote, Imovie, or Youtube link. Presenters can attend the meeting live and/or supply a prerecorded video or slideshow that could be used. The topic can be anything useful - a technique, tips for packing or entering shows, ideas about composition, etc. It's a great way to increase your teaching exposure and meet folks from other regions as well. These presentations will be available only by request from a regional rep for a specific regional/pod meeting. It will not be posted on the SAQA website or made available to the general membership.

Information to include with your presentation:

- Your name
- Short Description
- One photo of your work **or** headshot
- Type of presentation (video, slideshow, or live presentation)
- Your email address
- Website, blog, Instagram links, etc.
- If you are available to attend meetings
- Can your presentation be recorded by the region (many regional meetings are recorded, especially to allow for auto-translated captions). These recordings are only available for a couple months after the meeting and not shared beyond the region.
- Anything else you think we need to know about it
- Presentation files (video, PDF, slideshow, etc.). These can be uploaded directly into the form.

THE ARTIST'S QUESTIONS, ANSWERED IN FIBER

The committee is hard at work sourcing venues here in Florida as well as across the participating regions for this traveling exhibit. It is hoped everyone is busily creating their entry(ies).

Everyone, please keep in mind, **BIG SAQA IS COMING TO TOWN!** The Artist's

Question will premiere at Florida CraftArt in conjunction with SAQA's 2022 in person

Conference to be held in St. Petersburg! We want our exhibit to be an outstanding representation of the art created by our artists. This can only happen if you enter the exhibit. Even if you haven't yet started your piece, there's still plenty of time until the October 31 entry deadline to come up with an idea and turn it into a magnificent artwork.

There have been a couple of questions which I thought might be of benefit for the wider audience.

I. It was asked, "why doesn't this call for entry allow mounted work?" SAQA Florida's decision not to consider rigid, mounted, and

framed work is because the exhibit is being planned for travel to venues across the participating regions. To that end, "rigid" work would not only be difficult to transport, it also would incur high shipping costs.

2. Another question was, "I know the width is supposed to be 30 inches and the length is variable. Does the piece have to be a rectangle, or can it be oblong, and 30 inches wide at its widest point?" To which we answered, "As long a the width measures exactly 30 inches at some point along the length, it will meet the requirement."

While I don't know if this helped anyone other than the "questioner," perhaps it will open new opportunities as you create and develop your design. Should you have other questions and/or concerns, please don't hesitate to contact me:

Regina Dunn's "Square Challenge" was fantastic with each participant using her own unique style. Regina showed us pieces that she first created in a digital file then in paper and fabric. Teresa Stoller showed us two pieces, first a checker board and the second a fascinating fabric weaving. Chris Clark created a pattern on her I-Pad then had the fabric printed on poly satin by Spoonflower to create a breathtaking art quilt built on the Fibonacci sequence. Bobbi showed work based on squares that were printed as monotypes and screen prints in her beautiful organic style. Normajean showed 2 very different pieces but both

exhibiting 3-d squares. The first being tumbling blocks using rhombus shapes and the second being a

pincushion that is created using two five inch squares. (Note: Directions for the pincushion is free on her blog: http://seasew.blogspot.com/)

Due to unforeseen circumstances the scheduled program was postponed to a later date but Normajean jumped in to talk to the group about "Mail Art Mania" and how it was the catalyst to her fiber art writing career. She founded and ran a Yahoo Mail Art Trading Group called Fiber Art Traders, for 8 years with thousands of members around the globe, many of them SAQA members. She hopes to gain some momentum in Pod 4 beginning with an exchange of fiber art postcards and perhaps expanding to all SAQA members if there is an interest. There is no greater teacher than to own someone's art so it can be appreciated and examined up close. One of her mail art pieces will be featured in an upcoming issue of Quilting Arts Magazine.

Book Share: Linda Geiger: <u>The Simple Secret to Better Painting</u> by Greg Albert Summary: The most important secret is to use three colors in these proportions: Mostly, some, and a bit. Another important secret is to use contrast.

Presentation: Ellen Schwank: Silk Painting: A detail presentation with a step-by-step slide show. Using different types of silk including Habatai (10-12mm), silk organza. DynaFlo and Luminie paints and, InkTense Pencils work well. Resists can be used to detail a design on the silk before painting. Do not use a latex resist as a gutter. Steaming the piece after final paint is dry acts as a fixative. More detailed information on silk painting can be found. Ellen's handout that was sent to all members in an email.

give us a tour of her studio. Just for fun, everyone is asked to show us one item in their sewing studio that's not normally associated with sewing. And, of course, there will be show and tell.


