News... Florida Retreat Recap

Here is a short recap of our retreat last month at San Pedro Center in Winter Park. In the words of one member who attended our long awaited 2021 retreat "The retreat was amazing!" Everyone enjoyed working on their own projects, learning new things and enjoying the camaraderie of just being with fellow artists. It was a great opportunity to share ideas, observe the works in progress of

others and immerse ourselves in the lush surrounding environment. What a diverse and multi-talented group of artists we are!

The guest rooms were clean, well-appointed and comfortable and the food was great!

We had a well-lit and large room where all 28 of us had plenty of room to work while remaining socially distant.

Days were spent working on our projects, and learning from one another.

We had several short demonstrations: hand embroidery from Laura Parkel, 3D vessels from Joan Engel, and working with tulle from Jan Lipsky. These were well attended and quite interesting.

In addition, two people were using interesting techniques which others wanted to learn, so they did "pop up" demos for us. Linda Geiger taught us how to intentionally make fabric pucker and Ellen Nepustil showed us how to make paper shells.

The highlight was a 4-hour workshop presented by <u>Bobbi Baugh.</u> (Her work, **Becoming One With the Night**, is shown below)

Bobbi taught us for 2 hours on Saturday about the concept or story of our artwork. The next day she taught us for 2 hours about composition.

This was VERY useful, even for those who had art degrees. The slides Bobbi showed were excellent examples of what she was presenting. She shared samples of her own work as well as





artists in other mediums to demonstrate the thought process and techniques behind successful composition.

Each night we had some sort of group activity. The first night included silly ice breaking style games. Lots of laughter and great door prizes! The second and again on the third night we had wine and cheese. It was nice because participants stopped working and just enjoyed visiting. Good socializing! The third night was Show and Tell. Here are some photos.

News... Exhibition Committee Volunteer Caravan...

Our FL Exhibition Committee meets monthly on your behalf to set themes of interest; to find and secure venues suitable for exhibition of our artwork; and to ensure all works in a show are put together seamlessly. And, in between our meetings, committee members work to make sure all assorted tasks are done.

We thought it might be enlightening to share with you a behind the scenes glimpse into the adventure involving our current exhibit, *Floridian Flavors*. The exhibit made a big splash at its premiere venue, Leepa Rattner Museum of Art in Tarpon Springs.

Next: the escapade. When the show concluded at LRMA, the quilts were carefully

packed back into their original boxes in preparation for delivery by Ellen Simon to Peg Green's house for temporary storage. Ellen and her husband discovered that getting all the boxes in their vehicle required strategic packing!

Here's a summary of the October 31 caravan: Ellen picked up the boxed quilts from Peg. She drove to Bushnell to meet up with Regina Dunn. (There was another strategic, challenging car-packing to fit them in Regina's car.)

Packing completed, Regina drove to Bobbi Baugh's house in DeLand.

Together Bobbi and Regina unpacked each quilt from its box. They laid the quilts flat in Bobbi's vehicle, protected with some sheets, and stacked empty boxes on top. Another tight fit! The next day Bobbi drove everything to KC Grapes' (Kestrel Michaud's mother) house in Melbourne where they are now being safely stored flat on a spare bed. Sometime in December the quilts, along with their boxes, will be transferred to Kestrel's house (also in Melbourne) to reside for a short time. In

January Kathryn Robinson, another volunteer in the chain, will pick up the quilts and boxes and drive them to our final venue, Court House Cultural Galleries in Stuart.

A resounding thank you must be extended to both our Exhibition Committee and Florida Region members who so willingly volunteered. Our incredible volunteers took the utmost care and executed with due diligence the committee's stipulations for transport and storage.

When members step up, even intensive undertakings can be divided it into easy portions, so no one is overwhelmed. **Thank** you SAQA volunteers - you ROCK!

To our Regional Members, you absolutely don't want to miss this last opportunity to see Floridian Flavors: Characters, Culture, and Cuisine. Please make the effort to view the exhibit while at the Court House Cultural Galleries. You will not be disappointed!
