Pod 2 met Saturday March 26thin in Palm Coast for a Day of Art. What a beautiful day for 16 members to get together and collaborate on a quilt for an upcoming SAQA Global Exhibit entry.

We took 15 yard of fabric and divided it into 3 pieces, then took 10 different colors of paint and added the paint to the fabric to represent the movement of wind. After the paint dried, the fabric was divided by the number of participants to take home and add additional creative art movement. The pieces will be returned in April and then sewn back together and quilted to make one unified piece.

The greatest part of the day is when the group worked together to critique the painted fabric and discuss how to make this fabric into a single vision of wind. There was true collaboration with humor, learning and friendship.

A BIG thank you to Lisa Hamilton, Erica Dodge for the hard work in coordinating fabric, paint supplies and ideas to make the day. An Marshal for centering our thoughts and leading a successful discussion of collaboration, color and value of the piece of fabric and what will be the final piece.

Discussions: We had a lively discussion about the design decision making process many of us went through with our ARR pieces. A general consensus was that a great deal of psychological "fear" (if you weren't there you ask to be caught up by someone who was there) about making changes to someone else's work came up ie. painting, adding surface design etc. It was hard to let go of the idea that this belonged to someone else and take full ownership of the work at that moment it was in your hands. We talked about how to overcome this. This led us into exploring composition and design ideas.

There was another informative talk about plants and husbands that did not quite lead into quilting although it could provide peace of mind and tranquility to do more artistic work once planting was done. lol

POd 5 The meeting was held in the "barn" at the estate of member Ruth Anne Parker, in order to accommodate the hands-on demonstrations planned for the day. Members in attendance included Gabriele DiTota, Emma Newsham, Laural Parkel, Joan Engel, Linda Geiger, KC Grapes, Dij Pacarro, Ellen Lindner, Kestrel Michaud, Serina Rostek, and Kathryn Robinson. Also in attendance were guests Deanne Hansen and Rudy Picarro (husband of Dij.)

PRESENTATIONS

First was a presentation and hands-on exercises by Sarina, who first spoke about indigo dyeing. She showed samples and several folding techniques, then explained the dye process. She provided a dye pot and helped several members prepare their fabric for immersion into the indigo mixture. Sarina then demonstrated manipulating the color of fabric with marigolds, beets, and turmeric, and showed samples of fabrics altered with KoolAid and onion skins. Participants tried their hand at those techniques as well. Sarina suggested the book "The Craft of Natural Dyeing" by Jenny Dean.

Kathryn and Gabriele were up next, presenting the art of cyanotype printing on fabric using

chemicals and sunlight. Kathryn spoke about the "dry" process which gives crisper edges to the designs made by treating fabric with dyes, applying templates such as plants, then covering with glass and exposing the fabric to light. She showed product suggestions including pre-treated fabric and chemistry from the Jacquard company, as well as many samples she has made during her experimentation with the process. Gabriele demonstrated the "wet" process which is similar except the addition of water gives a softer edge to the design, and less control in the outcome, as well as some color variations. She also showed samples of her prints on cloth, as well as a finished quilt. Books recommended are "Cyanotypes on Fabric" by Ruth Brown, and "Blueprints on Fabric" by Barbara Hewitt, and a blog by artist Sue Reno was also mentioned as a source of inspiration.

The meeting began after the presentations.
