



As part of the final festivities, Kestrel Michaud gave an interesting and comprehensive Zoom presentation. She covered her art career from its early beginnings and discussed how she developed her methods for creating work.

The FL Exhibition Committee deserves thanks for their enthusiasm and diligence in making the *Floridian Flavors* exhibit successful. Other SAQA Florida members pitched in too.

While Ellen Simon, Regina Dunn, and Bobbi Baugh do serve on the committee, they did volunteer for extra duty transporting the quilts from and to various locations for storage between venues. 

Pod 5 On February 12 several members of Pod 5 took a field trip to visit an artist's studio in Melbourne, FL. The artist was Wilber "Mario" Quispe Huaman, a Master Weaver from Peru, and his partner, Weaver/Photographer Gwendi Flor. Mario demonstrated the process of spinning sheep's wool into yarn, how he dyes his wool using natural materials over a wood-burning fire, and finally his process for weaving gorgeous tapestries. Spinning this device is how Mario turns spun yarn into the large, 1.5kilo skeins (like the one hanging behind him).

Mario and Gwendi standing in front of a collection of 1.5kilo skeins of wool yarn, all of which were naturally dyed by Mario.

Mario lifting dyed wool yarn out of the 50gal pot.

Cochineal, a beetle that is used to make red dye (as seen on Mario's thumb). This is one of the natural ingredients Mario uses to dye his wool.

(Right) Mario demonstrates his method of weaving. He does not use any guide. He has the entire design in his head and knows exactly where to weave the colors to create the image he wants to make.

A tapestry woven by Mario when he was 19. It's about his time as a young boy in Peru when he was homeless and slept in a tree.
