
Java Landscape is 8 x 8 inches and mounted on a gallery wrapped canvas strainer. Tranquility is 24 x 55

Let the Fun with Jane Dunnewold Begin!

Things kick off with our **August 13**th **regional zoom meeting.** Starting at 2 PM, Jane will give us a 90 minute presentation called **Making Tools for Layered Compositions.** This event closely relates to the workshop in January of 2024. If you're considering attending the workshop it is HIGHLY RECOMMENDED that you attend this 90 minute meeting. Free to all SAQA Florida members.

On October 10th, at 7 PM, there will be a follow up meeting.

In this follow up session to the August lecture, Jane will share sets of tools created by participants, and discuss the strengths from a design and layering perspective. She'll also offer advice to further strengthen and build on the tools that have been created.

A call for volunteers for this session will go out in early September, in order to allow time for developing the presentation.

The BIG Event:

January 16-18, 2024: Live workshop with Jane about layering techniques to help tell your story.



The Complexities of Layered Printing on Cloth

In this three-day workshop, participants will develop strategies for printing layers of imagery on cloth. We will analyze size, shape, complexity, and color. Participants will work on fabrics dyed prior to the workshop, or on plain-colored fabric purchased commercially. We will be working with translucent, opaque, and metallic textile paint, and will discuss the use of clear extender to create paints that are sheer layers, as well as experimenting with *faux resist*, which is my answer to avoiding the toxic chemicals of the discharging process.

Each participant will produce between 3 and six lengths of cloth. The workshop will take place in Dunedin, and spaces will be limited.

This class will accommodate 20 students and a lottery will be held.

Lottery FAQ:

- Purpose? To determine which 20 people get to purchase a spot in Jane's class
- When? Starting August 28th.
- Is it First-Come-First-Served? No. You'll have a full week, until September 4th, to sign up for the lottery.
- How? You'll send an email to a special address, which will record your desire to purchase the class. The email will be shown on the <u>workshop information page</u>, starting August 28th.
- Any special requirements? You must be a current member of SAQA and a member of the Florida region. (Florida can be your first or second region.)
- How will I know if I get in? A random drawing will occur on September 5th. Lottery registrants will be notified on September 5th and 6th.
- How do I pay? Details will be provided. Starting September 11th, lottery winners will have until September 18th to register and pay for the workshop.

- What if I don't win a lottery spot? A wait list will be created, with the sequence determined as part of the random drawing. It's common for several slots to open up before the event.

The portal for submissions opens on the SAQA website on September 1. ALL SUBMISSIONS MUST BE RECEIVED BY SEPTEMBER 30, 2023 – MIDNIGHT.

2024 EXHIBITING:

Premiere... Venice Art Center – January 12 – February 7, 2024

Summer... We have verbal commitment for a big, in-person venue further north in Florida to display in June and July. Details will be announced as soon as we have a signed contract.

Fall ... The Exhibition Committee will be submitting this show to the Houston Quilt festival for 2024. There is no guarantee that we will be accepted. But we will make a strong presentation and hope! (We should know early in 2024 if we are accepted.)

Online: Our regional Exhibit will be available for viewing on the SAQA website. We will also upload it to the SAQA YouTube channel. Lots of people will be able to see the work.

2025 EXHIBITING: We do not have confirmed venues to announce. Yet! But we have had strong interest and feel confident that we will have more exhibition opportunities to announce. Stay tuned.

Why YOUR quilt matters

It's simple. We want the best exhibition possible. We want to give our juror a wonderful batch of submissions from which to put together a wonderful show. The stronger the exhibition the better venues we are likely to attract and the better our chances of showing in Houston.

THE MAGIC NUMBER!!! We currently have 312 members in SAQA Florida Region. I would love to receive AT LEAST 312 entries! (You can submit more than one.) Make work you love and are proud of. Submit with confidence. If you are not chosen, be grateful for what you learned and that you now have a piece you can display elsewhere. Effort put into creating work to exhibit is NOT wasted — accepted or not.

But wait... There's MORE!

Your exhibition Committee is hard at work. There are MORE projects in the works.

NEXT EXHIBIT (to travel in 2026-2027). We will be joining forces with two other states to create a fabulous regional exhibit. We will announce theme and other details as soon as the submissions close for "Awakening."

NEW ONLINE GALLERY OPPORTUNITY: The Florida region is working with main SAQA to create an online portfolio/gallery for Florida members. It will be an artistic, professional website that will include shopping cart capabilities for artwork sales. STAY TUNED! We will host a zoom meeting in September to announce the concept and answer questions. (Date-Time-Link to be announced.) We will proceed with the project if we have at least twenty artists interested. I am excited to talk with Florida SAQA friends to see if this project would be useful to our artists.


We had I I people join our challenge! Hint for this month is add repetition while keeping the piece harmonious. Bring the piece back in August in the same envelope please.

Angie shared more rusting pieces. The first one below just came back from SAQA regional travelling show, "The Artist's Question Answered in Fiber."




Leslie shared some fabric portraits she has done as well as some fabric beads. Lucy shared a self portrait piece.

Jane Dunnewold Lecture series: details were announced.

Exhibitions: SAQA Florida Awakening. Entries will be accepted between Sept 1 and Sept 30.

Bookshare: Dij led the group through an exercise from Jane Dunnewold's book Creative Strength Training regarding emotion in abstract art. Participants were given an emotion by Dij and had 30 seconds to draw (linework only) an abstract response to that emotion. At the end, participants shared how and why they expressed the emotion as they did and laid their images out for review by others.

Dij also shared that Jane has a great free video on YouTube regarding emotion in abstract art that she highly recommends. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HzsJRVrZsYE

Dij informed us that Jane's video references artist Hilma af Klint, a Swedish female artist who is now considered by art historians the first abstract artist although her work was not exhibited until decades after her death. Anne noted that she currently has tickets to see the Hilma af Klint exhibit in London in September and showed images of her works (all at least 7 feet tall) in exhibit. https://www.guggenheim.org/exhibition/hilma-af-klint

Presentation: Gabriela led a critique session for "glorious failures" or works in progress. Using an art analysis tool, the group evaluated each member's work using set of questions to "Describe", "Analyze", "Evaluate" and "Judge". After the group discussed the artist revealed the name of the piece and additional information on it.
