Jane Dunnewold Lottery Sign Up Open

After Jane Dunnewold's excellent lecture about tools the excitement for her January workshop has really been building! Here's the scoop:



Jane will be conducting a 3-day workshop January 16-18, 2024. It's called **The Complexities of** Layered Printing on Cloth, and you can find full information on the SAQA website <u>HERE</u>

Because this workshop is expected to be very popular, there will be a lottery to see who gets to sign

up. The lottery will be open August 28th - September 4th. To sign up for it, send an email to <u>flsaqalotto@gmail.com</u>. Include your name (as listed with SAQA) and your phone number.

Lottery FAQ:

Purpose? To determine which 20 people get to purchase a spot in Jane's class

When? August 28th - September 4th.

Is it First-Come-First-Served? No. You'll have a full week, until September 4th, to sign up for the lottery.

How? Send an email to <u>flsaqalotto@gmail.com</u>, including your name (as listed with SAQA) and your phone number.

Any special requirements? You must be a **current** member of SAQA and a member of the Florida region. (Florida can be your first or second region.)

How will I know if I get in? A random drawing will occur on September 5th. Lottery registrants will be notified on September 5th and 6th.

How do I pay? Details will be provided. Starting September 11th, lottery winners will have until September 18th to register and pay for the workshop.

What if I don't win a lottery spot? A wait list will be created, with the sequence determined as part of the random drawing. It's common for several slots to open up before the event.

On October 10th, at 7 PM, Jane will lead an additional meeting.

In this follow-up session to the August lecture, Jane will share sets of tools created by participants, and discuss the strengths from a design and layering perspective. She'll also offer advice to further strengthen and build on the tools that have been created. The first ten members to submit information (described below) will be the ones used in Jane's class presentation.

More details from Jane:

This is the process Jane wants to use for receiving your tool information for her feedback session in October:

1. Send pictures of individual prints that represent tools that have been made. For example, if stamps were carved, the picture should be of the printed stamps and several can be on one image. If a Thermofax was made, the picture should be of the print, not the Thermofax itself. If stencils were made, the image should be of the printed stencil etc. The idea is to send pictures of the printing done with the tool, so Jane can assemble those on the screen and see how they are working together and then make suggestions.

2. The photos should be of the printed surface only - no distracting backgrounds. If the edges show at all, the photograph should be taken only on a white or black background.

3. The photos should be 300 dpi and not too small. You will be contacted by Wayne, from Jane Dunnewold's team, if images are too small to use.

4. In addition to photos, send a written description of the tools, keyed to the pictures so that Jane will know what description goes with each picture.

5. Send images and descriptions to Wayne at <u>kwayne@janedunnewold.com</u>. Wayne is happy to provide first round feedback and will then pass off the images to Jane.

6. The deadline for sending materials to Wayne is September 25th so that he and Jane will have time to put everything together.

Old Business Rain Forest Exhibit - Kat

Kat reported she has spoken with several venues about exhibiting the rainforest quilts. She will photograph the ones she has so far to help promote the exhibit. We agreed it would be best if we had more pieces in the collection, so if you want to make another, please do. The dimensions must be 20" wide by 30" long and be in portrait orientation. Be sure that you use a D-ring on your slat which is large (not a tiny screw-in ring).

We brought several varied and unusual examples of mounting from simple stapled to stretcher bars to applying to painted stretched canvas (Pam)to making a series of 2 or 3 background quilts to build up presence (Trish), padded on stretcher bars (Nancy)

Jann showed a fantastic quilt of solids in brilliant color from a design in her sketchbook she created more than 13 yrs ago. Extremely complex. Maggie explained her new works using her own digital paintings printed on fabric and stitched, Leslie showed example of modern machine embroidery that was amazing, Nancy showed mounted zen tangle pieces she sells.



Next month Lynn Purple will do a hands-on demo of Inktense pencils, blocks, pens. We meet at Gulf Gate Library September 22, Friday, I pm to 3:15pm
