Perlie Petrillo is proud to announce her quilt, *Maya*, was awarded First Place in the Vero Beach Art Club show in Vero, Florida





Fiber Arts An Ancient Local Tradition Featuring the Dirty Dozen Fiber Artists





Karol announced "Loose Change," the current exhibit for her international group "Cloth in Common," will be hanging at the USF Library during the SAQA Conference!



Lucy gave a rundown on our retreat at the Franciscan Center Tampa on Jan 16, 2025.


Regional rep Angie brought the group up to date on the regional Art Meet & Greet on Feb 8, 2025 and the Global Conference in St. Pete in April, 2025.



Anne Kobus has a piece in the SAQA virtual exhibit "Mad Matters", and another piece in Sacred Threads. Anne will also give an artist talk in Houston.

The Dirty Dozen, which has several Pod 5 members, has a collection hanging in the Brevard Government Center sponsored by the Brevard Cultural Alliance.

Joan Engel has a quilt in the SAQA "Bearing Witness" exhibit.

Program: Linda Geiger presented the many products she created for the Jane Dunnewold class, <u>Confident Color.</u> The paint, extender, and substrates all affected the color. The class, while laborintensive, has helped Linda recognize colors and how to replicate them.

Ellen Lindner presented part 2 of her color talk. Ellen had previously covered the color wheel, temperature, identifying color, brightness and saturation, and similar or analogous colors. She led us through a couple of exercises in which we found magazine pictures with analogous colors and then complementary, split complementary, or triad colors.

Pod 5's next meeting will be a potluck/photo session November 9.




Pod 7 from Cindy Ambler
