



This month's meeting was hosted by Dariel and started at Ipm. Attending were Doris, Kat, Sharon, Gail, Karol, and Diane.

Kat spoke about her cross-country trip where she and her husband visited various quilt museums. They both enjoyed the displays at Visions, Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum as well as Arches, Bryce, the International Quilt Museum in Lincoln NE where Victoria Findlay Wolfe's "Option Expedition" exhibit was on display. Additionally, they checked out the National Quilt Museum in Paducah KY; the High Museum in Atlanta, which among other exhibits, was showing "Patterns in Abstraction: Black Quilts from the High's Collection (Gee's Bend quilts).

Our next exhibit, "Red" will be on display at One Blood Donor Center from early December until early February 2025.

We worked on finishing the final details on the Conference bags. There are 220 finished bags made for the Conference Kat will make 30 more bags for a grand total of 250! Members donated to help offset Kat's expenses. Doris and Dariel will meet with Kat to finish the project.

Kat asked us, and we agreed, to have an "internal challenge" to make a 12" x 12" quilt inspired by the post card shown in pictures. It will be due at our January 2025 meeting. While it would be nice, it doesn't need to be finished, it can be in progress. See inspiration Postcard Image below.

Kat also asked us to bring exhibit ideas to the December meeting for the Sewing Expo 2026 exhibit.

Thank you, Pat, for showing us how to create our own stencils with sheer fabric and mod podge.



techniques. Additionally, the artwork was to be a fixed size of 11 by 14 inches, and in a portrait orientation, and to be finished by October. Ellen then found the Octagon Gallery at the UU church to display the work. Pod 5 met at Kestrel Michaud's house November 9 for our annual potluck and photo session. Kestrel and her father, professional photographer Bob Michaud, photographed the member's quilts.

Much of the discussion centered on the postcard project for next year's SAQA convention.

Ellen demonstrated her slat hanging method. She uses D rings attached with silk or linen medical tape, I on one long side and 2 on the other. This enables the quilt to be hung from I or 2 hangers. She uses 6" stiff stabilizer at the top of her quilt.

Next meeting will be by Zoom on Dec. 16.
