
Frieda Anderson is thrilled to announce her acceptance into QuiltCon 2025 in Phoenix, AZ.

And more news from Frieda! She is pleased to have an article published in the Winter 2025 issue of Art Quilting Studio.









Our Next Exhibit: "TRIO"

Some important Exhibition numbers to remember for 2025 - 2027:

That's the concept for "TRIO." Any artistic creation that is composed with three elements, or is inspired by a group of three, or is created as a triptych is eligible for submission. This exhibition is a project of a TRIO of states: Florida, Georgia and South Carolina.

There are seven months remaining to create work for this exhibit. Submissions are due by July 31, 2025.



Already, the exhibition committee has secured venue contracts that total six months of display time at just our first two venues. Our premiere will be at Ormond Museum of Art (Dec 18, 2025 – March 1, 2026), then Tequesta ArtCenter (April 23 through July, 2026.) The show is scheduled to travel through 2027. The regions of Georgia and South Carolina are working on venues in those regions too.



far and wide. We spoke of origin stories of how we came to art quilting. We spoke of creativity and how to nurture it. Then we delved into one member's issues of trying to get words on a translucent base to be cut and put atop other fabrics that need to be seen through it. Several suggestions were made including using a printable translucent Lutrador and creating a "fabric" of mat medium over cheesecloth that can be peeled off of a piece of freezer paper and cut to shape. Our next meeting is in person on Jan. 20, 2025. We enjoyed seeing Melani's Christmas creations.
